Checklist of Environmental Factors – Assess the potential for impacts to the following resources/areas and coordinate as necessary:

Habitat/environmental sensitivity

Restrict survey to waterway. Do not cause physical damage to wetland shorelines.

Threatened/endangered species

Cultural/historical resources

Removal operations in certain portion(s) of this waterway may require prior coordination with SHPO.

Oyster habitat

State/federal/tribal lands

Scenic waterway

Removal operations within this waterway may require prior coordination with LDWF.

Summary and Conclusions of Environmental Review:

Habitat/environmental sensitivity: ESI map indicates that freshwater marsh habitat dominates the shorelines of the subject waterway.

Threatened/endangered species: ESI maps do not indicate the presence of any Federally-designated Threatened or Endangered species within the waterway.

Cultural/historical resources: At least one cultural/historical resource site is known to occur within/along this waterway. Removal operations in certain portion(s) of this waterway may require additional coordination with the State Historic Preservation Officer (SHPO).

Oyster habitat: No oyster leases occur within this waterway.

State/federal/tribal lands: The Salvador/Timkin Wildlife Management Area occurs along the southeastern reaches of the waterway.

Scenic waterway: This is a scenic waterway from Lac Des Allemands to Lake Salvador. Though the act does not prohibit the use of motorized boats in the waterways, there is a potential that

constraints may be applied to other operations in accordance with the waterway-specific management plan. Removal operations on this waterway may require additional coordination with LDWF (Keith Cascio 318/343-4045).
